Remember that we also have our uniform rail inside the main entrance to school so if you do need any uniform feel free to come and have a look.

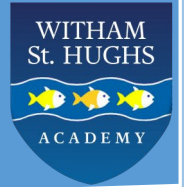
Y3 & Y4 watches

Witham St Hughs Academy have worked in partnership with Tickers, who have helped part-fund these watches for pupils. Parents are not being asked for any contribution towards the purchase of this.

Like our Y6 ties, these watches are an expected part of the Year 3 school uniform and should be worn each day.

Our current Year 4 pupils were provided with their watches last year, and again, are expected to wear these as part of their school uniform each day.

Beginning and end of the school day

The arrangements for the beginning and end of the day remain the same as were in place in the summer term.

The gates will open at 8.50am in the morning and at 3.25pm in the afternoon. The one-way system is still in place so where possible it would be appreciated if this could still be used

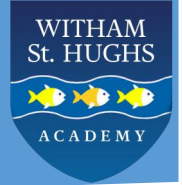
PTFA

Welcome back! It is lovely to see all the children back smiling and feeling positive. As they start a new academic year there are many changes they will encounter and differences to the routines they were used to before. To support the children in school we are talking about the new routines they will follow every day and ways to help them to remember.

At the start of any new school year the children can feel a little uncertain. They have a new teacher, new friends and a new classroom. Here are some key points to support children on their return to school;

Be positive

Talk about all the things that the children do at school each day. Who will they see? What will they do?

Have a routine

Make a visual routine to remind children what they need to do each morning before going to school. What do they need to wear? What do they need to take with them?

Ask questions

Encourage your children to ask staff any questions they have about the changes at school. Remind them who could help them if they are unsure of something or have any worries during the day.

Friendships

Support your children to make new friends in their classroom and at break times and lunch times. What games could they play?

Being together

Reassure your children that everyone at school is getting used to the new school year. The adults need to remember what to do as well and that everyone works as a team to make sure everyone is happy and safe.

Talking

When your children come home talk to them about their day. What has been the best part of the day? What have you learned today? What are you looking forward to tomorrow?

Pastoral Support

Ms Ford continues to support those children who may need additional support. She has dedicated time during the school day to talk to children about their feelings. These sessions take place in the nurture room on an individual or small group basis. There are a range of groups which Ms Ford regularly leads including :

* Young Carers * Bereavement * Separated families * Emotions and Feelings. Please do let us know if you would like more information about these groups or if you feel your child needs support.
