

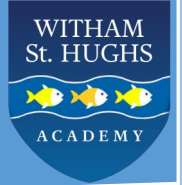

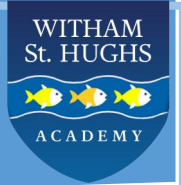

We are so proud of all of our children this term and you may have noticed that many of our KS2 children have already earned their bronze badges!

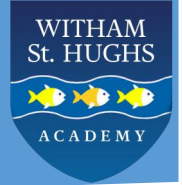


The PTFA would like to thank everyone who supported the Christmas fair either by donating items, holding a stall or attending the event.
