
Welcome from Witham St Hughs Academy






Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)

Early years education at Witham St Hughs
Academy forms the foundation of all future
learning. In our Reception classrooms, we provide
an effective curriculum which encompasses a
cross-curricular approach to the prime and specific
areas of learning:

- Personal, social and emotional development
- Literacy, communication and language
- Physical development
- Mathematics
- Understanding the world
- Expressive arts and design

Play is valued in the EYFS as an important vehicle for learning, both in child-initiated and guided activities. During the EYFS, our aims are to:



- Value each child's individuality.
- Provide a secure and stimulating environment which is happy and harmonious.
- Develop independence and self-confidence.
- Encourage enquiring minds and perseverance through child-initiated and guided play activities.
- Provide a smooth transition from home to nursery and then on to full-time education.
- Work together effectively with parents.







Our Curriculum

Our curriculum is designed to be creative, practical, purposeful and effective.

It promotes:

- A balanced and broad curriculum for all children.
- The highest quality of teaching and learning through structured play in the EYFS.
- A cross-curricular, thematic approach to learning.
- Opportunities to apply skills and extend knowledge and understanding through a creative, practical and purposeful curriculum.
- Enrichment of the curriculum through visiting speakers and educational visits.
- Development of independence and thinking skills.
- Parental involvement in pupil learning.
- Raising standards, expectations and achievements.
- Recognising and celebrating achievement.

Subjects





Reading

We strongly believe that it is every pupil's right to learn to read and we strive to ensure that every child is a confident, fluent reader by the end of KS1. We aim for every child to be able to 'read to learn', with a variety of genres embedded across the curriculum.

Writing

At Witham St Hughs Academy, the development of writing skills is embedded across the whole curriculum. By the time pupils leave school, they will be expected to write clearly, accurately and coherently for a variety of purposes and audiences, adapting their language and style as required.

Phonics

We follow the rigorous and sequential Read Write Inc. programme to teach phonics, ensuring our pupils enter KS2 as confident readers regardless of disadvantage or SEND needs. Due to attainment in Phonics, Witham St Hughs Academy has been appointed by the Department for Education as one of the 34 UK Specialist English Hubs.

Mathematics

We strive to ensure that all pupils become fluent in the fundamentals of mathematics. All pupils have the opportunity to reason mathematically, use mathematical language and understand the purpose and application of mathematics. We regularly recap topics to help pupils remember what they have learned in the long term.





Science

All pupils leave Witham St Hughs Academy with an enriched understanding of biology, chemistry and physics. Alongside theoretical and practical knowledge, children are equipped with the cultural capital required to understand the implications for science today and for the future. We strive to inspire all children to take an active role in the future of scientific developments and employment.

Design and Technology

At Witham St Hughs Academy, the teaching of design and technology involves the application of skills for life. Pupils develop an authentic creativity and understanding of practical, real-life problem solving. The design and technology curriculum also includes cooking and nutritional skills to support an understanding of where food comes from and how to cook.

Computing

We aim for all pupils to have an understanding of the fundamental principles and concepts of computing, including abstraction, logic, algorithms and data representation. We promote independence through our Digital Leader provision which encourages older pupils to inspire our younger learners' digital confidence and curiosity.

Art

We believe that all pupils should be encouraged to express their own artistic ideas to guide them on their creative learning journey. Our pupils build confidence across a range of materials and can demonstrate an increasing mastery of art techniques, including drawing, painting, textiles, collage, sculpture and print making.





Music

All pupils should perform, listen to, review and evaluate music across a range of historical periods, genres, styles and traditions. Our pupils understand and explore how music is created, produced and communicated, including through dimensions of pitch, duration, dynamics, tempo, timbre, texture, structure and appropriate musical notations.

History

We believe that all pupils should have a high-quality history education which stimulates minds and encourages children's interest. We believe history teaching should equip all pupils with knowledge beyond their own living memory and offer awareness that enables children to understand our world today.

Geography

At Witham St Hughs, we believe that a high-quality geography education should inspire an environment of curiosity and fascination about our world, and allow pupils to be engaged global citizens.

We are providing opportunities for our children to develop their understanding of sustainability within our world and allow them to think deeply about how we can work together to help support this belief.

Religious Education

At Witham St Hughs Academy, we believe that a high-quality religious education is essential to achieving an environment of curiosity and respect towards different beliefs and customs and creating well-rounded, knowledgeable pupils. The children also compare religions to current society and learn about atheism.

Pupils also take part in daily acts of worship. These are Christian in essence and follow an agreed theme each week. They usually consist of a brief talk or story to prompt reflection on the values within the academy.

Parents have the right to withdraw their child from RE lessons and daily acts of worship (assemblies). Any request should be made in writing to the Headteacher.

French

The high-quality Modern Foreign Languages curriculum at Witham St Hughs Academy aims to provide pupils with the skills needed to be able to engage with the wider world. Our chosen language is French, which is taught through the comprehensive and progressive 'Language Angels' scheme linked to class topics.

Character Education

At Witham St Hughs Academy, we emphasise the importance of preparing pupils for life outside of school and truly believe that success is not solely measured by academic achievement. Our character curriculum has been carefully designed to include all elements of PSHE, British Values, Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural development and philosophy.

Physical Education

Through our physical education curriculum, pupils develop a positive relationship with physical health, activity and personal wellbeing. Pupils learn about concepts of fair play, sportsmanship, teamwork and resilience, and develop cultural capital through one-off exceptional learning experiences.

Taste Education

At Witham St Hughs Academy, we follow the Taste Education scheme, which aims to help children grow up to enjoy healthy foods and have a positive relationship with food and their own bodies. Taste Ed equips children with the tools and experiences needed to become confident, adventurous, healthy eaters.

Some pupils may demonstrate exceptional performance within certain subject areas in or outside of school. Witham St Hughs Academy is committed to developing an ethos that supports and celebrates the learning needs of all children. Provision for more able children is an integral part of our teaching programme. Children identified as being exceptionally able have

Individual Challenge Plans (ICPs) which are reviewed on a termly basis with the child's class teacher, the school's More Able, Gifted and Talented Coordinator and the parent. The aim of the ICPs is to ensure that very able children are provided with an educational experience appropriate to their needs.

SEND Provision

At Witham St Hughs Academy, we aim to provide an education to meet the individual needs of all our children. The term Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) refers to any children who may at some time require additional help or guidance from our team.

Any child requiring additional support will be placed on our SEND register according to their level of need and given targets in the form of an Individual Education Plan. Parents will always be informed of the decision to place a child on the register and will be involved in agreeing what action should be planned via regular contact with our SEND Co-ordinator (SENDCo).

As well as a SENDCo, the academy benefits from the support of outside agencies such as Emotional & Behavioural Support, Educational Psychologists and Speech and Language Therapists. Such agency involvement will only take place with the consent of the child's parents and regular review meetings will be held to discuss progress.

The academy adopts a positive attitude towards all individual needs, and no child will be denied a place at Witham St Hughs Academy due to a disability as long as places are available and we are able to meet the specific needs in the best interests of the child. All accommodation is on one level, and most doors can accommodate wheelchairs. The academy can be accessed without needing to negotiate steps. If you have any concerns about your child, whether social, academic, physical or emotional, please let us know so that immediate action can be taken.

Pupil Voice





We provide a wide range of opportunities for our pupils outside of their curriculum lessons. Extracurricular activities, student councils and leadership opportunities allow our pupils to develop into well-rounded, confident young people who care about their community and are ready for their next steps.

Communities Council

Representatives from every class throughout the academy are elected by their peers to be part of our Communities Council. They attend regular meetings and are expected to feed back to their class. They often choose to raise money for good causes at a local, national and international level.

Eco-warriors

Our academy Eco-Warriors are elected representatives from each class who care passionately about our environment. They campaign to raise awareness in school about important issues such as recycling, wasting water, the use of electricity and the 'Global Goals'.

Prefects

Our prefects are a team Year 6s who are specially chosen to represent their peers and support younger children within the academy. They are selected due to their exceptional manners, attitudes and personal development. Prefects ensure that our academy values are upheld and are positive role models on the playground for all pupils.

Curriculum Champions

Our curriculum champions help lead a range of subjects across our Academy. They work alongside our staff subject leaders to ensure that our curriculum is engaging, exciting and challenging for all.

Mini-Police

Our Mini Police team undertake a rigorous application and election process. They work alongside local PCSOs to ensure that everyone in our school community feels safe and cared for. Their caps identify them on the playground and younger pupils can seek their help and advice when resolving conflict at break and lunch time.

Ministry of Food

Our Ministers of Food apply to our midday leader for their role and work one lunchtime per week to support our midday team. They help pupils coming off the playground to ensure their hands are clean before they eat their lunch, ensure younger pupils know the meals they are eating and even help to clean up the hall at the end of lunchtime.



Enhanced Provision



Enhanced Provision is Witham St Hughs Academy's extracurricular offer which provides children with the opportunity to develop skills beyond the school curriculum. This covers art, sport, science, music, community and performance. All clubs run after school from 15:30 - 16:30.

Behaviour



We aim to secure an exemplary standard of pupil behaviour in the academy through establishing and maintaining rules and discipline which pupils understand, respect and follow. We aim to build upon high standards of classroom discipline to foster in our pupils a sense of social responsibility towards the school and the wider community.

We expect all pupils to show:



Respect for other people.

This includes speaking politely, offering friendship and putting hands up in lessons.

Respect for other people's property.

This includes using equipment carefully, only using what you need and returning equipment correctly.

Respect for other people's right to learn.

This includes putting your hand up to offer answers, acting calmly and concentrating on your own work.

Uniform

The staff and Governors of Witham St Hughs Academy value and take pride in our academy dress code and believe that uniform nurtures a sense of belonging, which is in keeping with the aims and values of the academy.

In the interest of maintaining a safe and calm academy environment, we do not allow:

- Jewellery (other than a plain pair of ear studs and one small object of religious significance)
- Smart watches
- Extreme haircuts
- Distracting accessories
- Fake-tattoos / transfers
- Nail varnish









Admissions

Witham St Hughs Academy's policy for admissions is summarised below.

In accordance with relevant legislation, the allocation of children with an HCP where the school is named on the plan, will take first place.

When the academy is over-subscribed, places will be allocated according to the following criteria:

- 1. The child is in the care of the Local Authority (LAC) or has previously been in care (PLAC).
- 2. There is a sibling on roll at the academy at the time of application.
- 3. The child's parent is a member of staff and has been employed at the academy for two or more years at the time of application.
- 4. In terms of distance between home and school, the following will be taken into consideration in the order below:
 - i. Whether our academy is the closest school to the home address.
 - ii. The distance from home to school in a straight line.
