What is our Enrichment Programme?

At Witham St Hughs Academy, our Enrichment Programme offers pupils a diverse range of extra-curricular experiences that complement and enhance the curriculum. These opportunities enable children to develop new skills, pursue their interests, and grow in confidence while enjoying memorable experiences with their peers.

What kinds of opportunities will be available to my child?

We have carefully considered the breadth of provision on offer to cover art, sport, STEM, language and literacy, community and humanities. Most clubs will run throughout the academic year, allowing children to develop and build upon their skills over time. Some clubs will be offered on a termly basis and may change each half term to provide pupils with a variety of exciting enrichment opportunities. You may notice that there are slightly more clubs available to KS2 than KS1. This is simply because KS1 comprises two year groups, while KS2 comprises four year groups. All clubs will run after school from 3:30pm to 4:30pm. In addition to our after-school clubs, we also offer a range of wider enrichment opportunities, experiences and leadership roles throughout the year. These additional opportunities are free of charge and complement our club provision and enable pupils to further develop their interests, talents, character and personal skills. Details of some of these additional offerings can be found below on page 4.

Why is there a charge for all clubs?

Due to the high quality of external providers, all clubs require a small charge to ensure that these can be offered to pupils. Many of these clubs are being heavily subsidised by the Academy to ensure they remain affordable. Staff clubs are also subject to a charge, to ensure that high quality resources can be purchased to support this offer. Academy staff do not receive any of this money themselves; it is all used to fund the resourcing of clubs for the benefit of pupils. We have purposely ensured that all clubs are charged at the same rate, to guarantee that cost is not a factor in children's choices of enrichment. Pupils in receipt of the Pupil Premium, will be able to access one club per term subsidised fully by the Academy.

Who will be running these sessions?

A significant number of sessions will be run by external providers, who are experts in their field. A number of other sessions will be run by the school staff team, who will be giving their time to offer children this enrichment after school.

Why do children need to commit to a full term?

Numerous research studies highlight the academic and social benefits of sustained extra-curricular engagement. Just like clubs children may attend at weekends, the longer children commit to developing a new skill, the more successful they are likely to become. We have therefore decided that children should commit at least 1 'big' term (Autumn, Spring or Summer) to developing a new skill, before reviewing if they wish to continue. To enable as many children as possible to experience our enrichment opportunities, club places will be reallocated at the start of each term. This will provide all pupils with the opportunity to try new activities and develop a wide range of interests and skills throughout the year.



How do I book?

This brochure will be updated before the start of each term, allowing parents and carers to view the latest club offer and select activities for their children. Details of the booking process and any relevant deadlines will be shared alongside each updated brochure. Bookings will open ahead of each term, with the exception of the Autumn Term, when bookings will open at the start of September. Parents and carers will receive a text message when the booking system goes live and spaces become available for the upcoming term's clubs. To secure a place, payment must be made via SchoolMoney at the time of booking. Our booking window remains open for several days, enabling families to book at a time that is convenient for them. If your child is eligible for Pupil Premium funding, please contact the school office team who will be happy to help.
