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Parents Evening

We are truly grateful for the overwhelmingly positive responses in the Parent Questionnaires at our recent Parents Evening. We really do value your feedback and act upon this wherever possible. Outcomes and comments shared are shared at the back of this newsletter.

Car Park Fences

One area raised through the parental survey at Parents Evening was the fencing around the car park. We recognise that there are small adjustments that need to be made in regards to this fencing and these will be happening over the coming weeks. As always, our main priority is always to keep our pupils and parents safe.

After school clubs

After school club provision is an area of constant review and discussion between the Academy and parents in order to best meet the needs of our pupils. Whilst some after school clubs are offered at a nominal charge by external agencies, a significant number are offered free of charge by Academy staff above and beyond the school day. We have researched after school club provision by other Lincoln schools and we took a sample of 10 local settings. After school club offers ranged from 3 clubs in a term to 11 with an average number of clubs offered being 7. Witham St Hughs Academy offered 17 clubs to pupils in Term 1. We are always open to constructive feedback in terms of our club provision and work hard to offer 'above and beyond' for our pupils in this area. If any parents feel they are able to offer an after school club themselves, please speak to the school office.

Parental Forum

We are always keen to work alongside parents to ensure the most effective provision within the Academy. As such, we are holding our next parental forum on Friday 15th November at 3:00 - 3:30. 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
Crisp packets
