Reminders

Please can you make sure that when queuing for the gate to open in the morning, your children are not playing in front of the automatic doors making them open and close. Visitors have been finding it difficult to get past them and this can be avoided.

With regards to conversations, please also be reminded that we expect parents to show respect to our teaching team. We do not expect our teaching staff to be spoken to disrespectfully and this will not be tolerated and is unacceptable—especially when other children are around.

We appreciate that there are circumstances in school where discussions need to take place but these must remain amicable at all times. If you feel strongly, it is advisable to arrange an appointment so that it can be discussed inside school.
